The Board has noted that members of the club are participating in therapy at many different locations and wish to commend the club members on their activities. Participants are reminded that the clubs insurance does **NOT** cover members or their dogs in the event of an incident unless the visit is a "club sponsored" event. At present the club has not authorized any club sponsored events for guite a while and we have none planned for the near future. Members are reminded that they could be held legally liable for damages or injuries, as well as legal costs if something happens or a claim/suit is filed. Remember that all dogs should be certified through TDI, Delta or another therapy organization to participate in any therapy activity as some of these organizations provide insurance coverage that may respond if an incident takes place while on an authorized visit. Members are encouraged to contact their certifying organization to determine exactly what coverage would be available and in what specific situations.

"AKC Breeder of the Year" to be Announced at AKC/Eukanuba National Championship -

New York, NY - The American Kennel Club® announced today the seven group recipients of the 2008 AKC® Breeder of the Year Award. The award honors breeders who have dedicated their lives to improving the health, temperament and quality of purebred dogs.

"It is a thrill to honor these individuals whose longstanding breeding programs have produced many successes not only for their kennel, but for their breed as a whole," said Ron Menaker, AKC's Chairman of the Board. "They deserve recognition for the time and effort they have put into breeding and exhibiting quality dogs and improving upon the foundation of their breeds."

A breeder is chosen from each of the seven groups: Sporting, Hound, Working, Terrier, Toy, Non-Sporting and Herding. The individual group recipients will receive a medallion in recognition of their achievements on Sunday, December 14, 2008 at the AKC/Eukanuba National Championship. At the end of the presentation the 2008 AKC Breeder of the Year will be announced. Additionally, a canine portraitist will be commissioned to commemorate a prominent dog from the recipient's kennel, and their name will be inscribed on a perpetual trophy and plaque on permanent display at the AKC headquarters in New York City.

Doggy Dictionary
